

Safeguarding Survey Results Summer Term 2023/24

Question	Quantitative Data	Qualitative Data
Do you feel safe at school?	96% agreed	<i>'The teachers make me feel safe'</i> <i>'All the children are kind, that makes me feel safe'</i> <i>'I can always go to someone if I need something'</i>
	4% disagreed (all said they sometimes felt unsafe)	<i>'Sometimes if I go too far from an adult I don't feel safe (on the field)'</i> <i>'Once I fell off the bars, I didn't feel safe then'</i> <i>'When it rains and the playground is slippery'</i> <i>'Sometimes I worry that a scary animal might come through the hedge'</i> – we discussed what we would do if there was an animal on the playground – lockdown alarm etc, come inside and stay safe.
What makes you feel safe?	98% were able to answer	<i>'All the teachers, there's always someone there to help'</i> <i>'The fences keep us safe'</i> <i>'That all the teachers are familiar, we know everyone, they have friendly faces'</i>
Who helps you if you have a problem? How do they help?	98% knew who can help	<i>'The teachers help us solve our problems'</i> <i>'Our friends are very helpful, even other children who we don't know will help if they see you are hurt or sad'</i> <i>'The play leaders help at lunchtime'</i>
Can you name some school rules that keep you safe?	100% could name at least one rule	<i>'Stay inside the fences, then the adults can keep you safe'</i> <i>'Listen to your teacher, if you hear the fire alarm, go onto the playground quickly'</i> <i>'Always listen to the adults'</i> <i>'If you follow the golden rules then everyone will be safe and happy'</i>
How do you know which adults are supposed to be in school?	98% knew to look at lanyards	<i>'All staff wear blue lanyards, Miss Green has an ELSA one because she can help us and listen'</i> <i>'Governors wear purple'</i> <i>'Visitors wear red if they have to stay with another safe adult but if they wear green you can be with them on your own'</i> <i>'Mrs Harper Cole wears a black lanyard because she keeps us all safe'</i> Some children remembered that Miss Hume and Mrs O'Neill also help to keep everyone safe (they are our safeguarding leads too).
What would you do if you heard the fire alarm?	100% knew the correct answer	
How do you keep yourself safe in school?	98% could name at least one way	<i>'Listen to the adults carefully'</i> <i>'Don't go in the fire circle at Forest School and stand away from the edge while your toasting your marshmallow'</i> <i>'Follow the rules'</i>
How do you keep others safe in school?	98% could name at least one way	<i>'Always be ready to help if someone hurts themselves'</i> <i>'Follow the rules, especially walking in the corridor, otherwise you might bump into someone and hurt them'</i> <i>'Play kindly then other people won't get hurt'</i> <i>'Tell an adult if you're worried about someone'</i>
How would you stay safe online?	98% could name at least one way	<i>'Don't talk to strangers – think stranger danger and turn off the iPad and tell a teacher'</i> <i>'Never reply if a stranger starts sending you a message – tell your family or a teacher if you're at school'</i> <i>'If a scary picture or video comes up, close your iPad and tell (your teacher)'</i> <i>'Never give anyone your information or password'</i>
What is your favourite thing about Valley End?	100% had an answer	<i>'I love our field, we have so much space and fresh air'</i> <i>'Learning new things, especially challenges in maths'</i> <i>'That you're training us to stay safe if there was a fire... we will be ok'</i> <i>'The teachers, because they are so kind and happy and fair'</i> <i>'Making new friends, the children are kinder than at my last school'</i>
