

## Reception Learning Objectives

Autumn Term w/b 9<sup>th</sup> September

This week in school we will be learning...

**English** – We will be listening to stories that relate to our topic 'All About Me' and singing familiar nursery rhymes.

**Phonics** – (Will start the following week)

**Maths** – To be able to quantify sets of objects by subitising, rather than counting. We will be focusing on children being able to say how many there are in a small group of objects by 'just seeing' and knowing straightaway without needing to count.

**Understanding of the World** – To be able to talk about themselves and their families. This term our topic is 'All About Me'. We will be looking at our similarities and differences and what makes us special.

Over the next two weeks in school we will be learning...

**Communication and Language** – To be able to listen to others one on one or in a small group. We will also be continuing to understand the use of objects and tools in our learning environment to build independence.

**Physical Development** – To develop their small motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. We will be practising with lots of different tools to prepare them for the correct pencil grip.

**PSED** – To be able to see themselves as valuable individuals. We will be continuing to get to know the children and their families.

**Expressive Arts and Design** – To be able to use different tools and materials to create. We will be looking at different ways to create self-portraits of ourselves.

### Notes

This half term our topic is 'All About Me' which will include learning about how we develop as we grow older. If any parent has a new baby that they would like to bring in and talk to the children about, please contact your class teacher to arrange a visit.

Within this topic, we will be learning about people who help us. If any parent works within the community e.g. police officer, nurse, vet and would come in to talk to the children about their job, please contact your child's class teacher.
