# Reception Learning Objectives

## Autumn Term w/b IIth December

## This week in school we will be learning...

**English** — to discuss a familiar book. We will be having 'book talk' this week about our likes and dislikes about familiar stories. We will also be discussing how parts of the book made us feel and noticing any patterns throughout the story.

<u>Phonics</u> — we will be reviewing the learning from this half term and carrying out the Autumn 2 phonics assessments.

<u>Maths</u> — to explore the composition of 5. We will be looking at different ways we can make the number 5 by exploring different patterns that the number 5 can make. We will be showing this in different ways using five frames, part-whole models and die frames.

<u>Understanding of the World</u> — to retell the Christmas story. We will be practising in our Christmas play this week and will be discussing the story in class. We will talk about the characters and important parts of the story and creating story maps to support this.

### Over the next two weeks in school, we will be learning.

Communication and Language — to use vocabulary, including phrases, from recently read stories in conversations e.g. children can talk about the angel in the Nativity and why it was important

Physical Development — we will be drawing maps, transport, and making junk model vehicles.

PSED — to help others. We will be discussing how we can help our friends and others and setting challenges for the children to show this in their play.

Expressive Arts and Design — to sing in a group. We will be learning and practising the songs for our Nativity play. We will be practising singing altogether in a group.
